Withering Oaks Life is No Picnic in Ojai Retirement Community

e live under a cloud of fear; *fear of* eviction, fear of having to somehow find another place in these days of higher rents and shrinking Social Security

Most of us are elderly and mostly stove-ups in one way or another. If we were injured and hospitalized for recovery we could be evicted and our property seized by management. Management now charges tenants for repairs and for light bulb replacement (fluorescent tubes in kitchen light boxes – not easily *removed*) but will not properly fix cracked

foundations or broken roofs. Theft has occurred in many Whispering Oaks units and management, after more than twelve years, has refused to change locks. Tenants have come home to find a certain ex-

resident either inside or exiting their units. Management has inserted people who need constant supervision, as well as constant medication who would harm themselves and others if not watched - one guy threatened to

stab us all during the night. This is an adult community – however one unit is rented to a nice single mother with

two pre-teen boys. Their back door is directly opposite the front door of a whacko – only twenty feet away - who is often out of control, causing the sheriff to take him away for 3 days at a time.

Two summers ago the whole place was dug up for months to replace our individual water lines. Piles of dirt insensitively placed made my entrance sidewalk impassible for several days, including a weekend we were left with dust, mud or both. As well, we had 150 pounds of water pressure, instead of the required 60 pounds. It took six months of nding and work orders to get the problem fixed, but not before the overhead water sprinkler blew out – sprang a leak in my kitchen, on a weekend. I called the "**Whispering Oaks** *Emergency* Number" and a guy showed up two hours later. The fire dept. also showed up because an alarm went off at their station -Ibelieve that was what the firemen said A water line also blew during the night in a lady's

kitchen She has the collapsing foundation Four to 5 years ago a major water line broke, between bungalows, down by the main building at night. This was on a weekend and the fire dept. couldn't find the shut off valve or get hold of *Housing* to turn off the water. It gushed a 6" thick fountain for hours. Later, management complained about our water

We now pay an extra \$10 per month for "increased utilities" although we do pay our own utilities except for water and outside lighting As of this October the tenants have been subjected to eight inspections over the year, whereas I believe only one inspection per year is allowed by law Adequate notification isn't always given. Example: September, about 5pm on a Thursday a notice was taped to my front door saying painters would be painting our front doors the next day, Friday, and as (Friday) was manager Angelas' day off we had to be home to open the door for the painters. As they did not ad a dryer to the paint, it took 8 hours for the paint to dry so we had to leave our doors open. We had to stay home all day. The paint was deadly smelly also.


October: Our last inspection was touted as "mandatory" and everyone was to be included. We were not informed, but only a "sampling" of units were actually inspected. Not the first time we've been coerced into prepping for a *no-show inspection*.

Three to 4 years ago ... We were all forced to get assigned parking for our cars, then when two units were rented to couples with 2 cars per household, the parking policy was thrown out

Tenants are not allowed to attach anything to their building so we can't get dish satellite – only coaxial cable – not the faster fiber

One tenant tried to get management to fix a broken metal fence – was told it didn't belong to Whispering Oaks – by letter!, then when he put a satellite dish on the fence they said it was theirs. He showed them the letter. He still has the dish on the fence



MID-LIFE id-life crisis" has become a household **V** word. When we see our mid-life friends and colleagues behave in odd and surprising ways or when depression, despair, anxiety and hypochondriasis hit, we quickly diagnose it as a mid-life crisis. Usually this is easier to see in others and takes a little longer to acknowledge within ourselves

It is not, however, only a "modern crisis." As early as 1300, Dante, when he was 42-years-old, expressed his own mid-life crisis in the opening stanzas of his Divine Comedy: "In the middle of the journey of our life, I came to myself within a dark wood where the straight way was lost. Ah how hard it is to tell of that wood, savage and harsh and dense, the thought of which renews my fear. So bitter is it that death is hardly more.

Depression and other symptoms are necessary as powerful incentives for renewal and change. In mid-life we must make our fears our agenda (more on that in a later article). No change will occur if we see our life as problems caused by others! Most of my patients are in their middle years. It is a time where the greatest inner unfolding is possible, if one can only sit still long enough and look within to connect with one's soul, the place where true wisdom resides. Psychologist Marmor studied thousands of people going through a mid-life transition and found they fall into four basic categories:

(1) Individuals in the first group deny getting older through "Frantic Activity". They run from meeting to meeting, phone call to phone call, T.V. show to T.V. show unable to sit still and relax. They literally race through life avoiding reflection and pay no attention to their inner world where the healing impulse always originates during mid-life.

(Ž) People in the second group also deny getting older and do it through "Overcompensation." These are the 50-year-old men with chains around their necks chasing 20-year-old girls, or 45vear-old women on their 15th plastic surgery. Determined to stay young, these folks become prisoners to the soulless garbage coming out of Hollywood and Madison Avenue, or prey to the greed driven "Health and Fitness terrorists."

(3) "Decompensation" with the psychological symptoms like depression, psychosomatic illnesses and anxiety is what happens to the third group. Usually individuals in the first two groups end up here as well. Unless we begin to explore our inner life, the danger exists that we get stuck here and suffer a condition called "hardness of heart" seen in some of our older people.

(4) Finally there are some who might spend time in the first three groups, but don't get stuck there. They are different insofar as they take time to sit still, to be quiet and listen to messages coming from within - including dreams, fears, intuitions, imaginations, visions and what Levinson calls "other voices in other rooms." The inner realm is the only place where answers for the second half of life come from. A need for "external affirmation" has to be replaced by "inner validation." Eventually they reach a place called "Integration" where they live a much more creative life with less narcissistic self-involvement.

You know I sure would like to be able to make a guaranteed profit like that on my money. My savings account pays .5 percent. It doesn't seem fair does it?

Well there is the state agency called the CPUC (California Public Utility Commis-

The CPUC serves the public interest by protecting consumers and ensuring the provision of safe, reliable water service and infrastructure at reasonable rates. Of course I call the **CPUC** the California Private Utility Commission. That is because they seem to protect the profits of the private water utility more than they do the reasonableness of rates to the consumer Otherwise Golden States rates would reflect the other water providers.

Yes I know who Casitas Water is. I received water from them for 13 years Good water provider. Their water rate for the first **CCF** is only \$0.83, Golden States is \$3.80 with surcharges for the same amount. Bah Humbug to Golden State!!

Casitas is not regulated by the California Private Utility Commission. They have elected board members that are *accountable* to their voters. Casitas provides safe reliable water at very reasonable rates to their customers. They are a great municipal water district **Casitas** manages and maintains their water system in the best interests of consumers. There is a stark contrast between Casitas Water and Golden State Golden State cares about profits.







Canola Seed had GMO contamina against which there is no defense. A U.K. study found genetically-engineered canola cross-pollinating with conventional canola crops over 15 miles away. In some instances, organic farmers have even lost their organic certification because their crops were unintentionally contaminated with GMOs from other farmers' nearby fields.

The repercussions can be even more serious, though. Contamination of conventionally-grown rice in the South by GMOs led to European, Japanese and Russian buyers halting their imports of U.S. long-grain rice. **11.000 U.S.** rice farmers sued the producer of the GMO rice, and won a settlement of \$750 million from the Bayer company, said the New York Times on July 02, 2011.

Our planet's heritage of food crops is also at risk of being changed forever. In Mexico, where GMO corn is illegal to grow, Nature (the scientific journal) reported in 2001 that contamination by GMOs had been found in an area where the greatest diversity of native corn varieties is located. This means that the building blocks for all future corn breeding for our planet have now been genetically ntaminated. This cannot be undone. The Mexican government called it "the world's worst case of contamination by genetically modified material because it happened in the place of origin of a major crop.

The European Union has been the major holdout against GMO crops. Only a tiny percentage of European farmland is planted with **GMO** crops and public opposition to GMOs remains strong. Sixty-five percent want no GMOs and fully 95 percent support the European Union's mandatory labeling of all foods containing GMOs. The exception is that the import of GMO grains for feeding European livestock is allowed, and the resulting meat and dairy products do not require a GMO label. (70 percent of their animal feed is imported, mostly GMO soy and corn from the U.S.)



When considering a decision about a medical treatment, we focus on the future and a particular aspect of our life that would be negatively affected by the pro-posed treatment. What we might lose becomes the main factor in our decision-making. The book validates the difficulties many of us face in the health care arena - our doctors' recommendations, dissenting expert opinions, confusing statistics, sensational media reports, our friends' advice, Internet claims and drug *company ads*. Conflicting information pulls us back and forth.





Display - Art Protest at the Ojai Center for the Arts

by Sylvia Raz **he bear event...**...this is what happened. I had an installation in one of the **Ojai Art** Center "windows". It commemorated and celebrated the lives of the bears of Ojai. It intended to protest the unnecessary killing of innocent animals. Two years ago a bear came down the mountains to feed, and instead of being removed to his natural habitat, it was killed. Some months ago, another bear was shot when he came down to eat a chicken in a badly constructed coop, leaving a beautiful animal left to die in the mountain, and an orphaned baby

My feeling is, we live here in a place that's akin to paradise, and the animals were here before us, and we are proud to have them in Oiai.

Can't we be more compassionate and smarter in the way we treat them? If we want chickens, can't we build bear proof coops? Are chickens more important than bears, because we eat them?

The installation consisted of a crucified bear, being mourned by a large group of teddy bears, being guarded by the executioners (*the chickens*), with hoods and revolvers. Visitors to the exhibit were invited to express their opinions in a notebook, in poetry, prose or drawings, and these were shared at the reception, on Dec. 3. The title of the exhibit was "Di. es I. rae- Kaddish", which are Hymns in Latin and Hebrew recited in honor of the dead.

I'm committed to do this every time a bear is unnecessarily killed in Ojai, because I believe certain deeds call for a reaction, and this sometimes very cruel society calls for strong reactions. The work is a combination of ready made and conceptual as well as found objects art, where at the same time I clean the world up a little bit.

I feel strongly that we must intervene to educate the people and especially the authorities that make wrong decisions about our treasures in our blessed surroundings. Thank you very much, and have a very happy new year. – Sylvia Raz, Ojai





Patty Kelly has an uncanny knack for locating these "finds" which take us back to that essential warm fuzzy childhood time and place.

If you're looking for designer art, crafts, and American folk art, Human Arts is the place, with many items from outside Oiai too. Many of the artists who supply "HA" create art specifically for the store, having been carefully guided and preened by the store owners.

Most art lovers don't know, but back in the 80s Ojai had an art furor lasting several months. It seems a group of local core Ojai Artists had a novel idea, make art for all. it as they had their own myopi controlling and bleached idea of art, and what Ojai was. Unfortunately the city shut down the artists creating the "Arts Commission" in
